Service learners at Academies of Entrepreneurship mentored high school students in business classes at local high schools. At the Green Project, a non-profit organization dedicated to encouraging and promoting responsible living, a student helped review and update the organization's business plan in order to help prepare the Green Project for future growth and expansion. Through the Kids Star Program, students worked with children ages 8-12 at an after school program and helped paint a fence with the children. Service learners also acted as supervisors and mentors for art classes. Students working with Individual Development Accounts (IDA) scheduled home visits and over-the-phone interviews with IDA participants and took pictures of recent homeowners and their new houses. The service learners analyzed the data and prepared a presentation based on the results. Students also made calls to various academic and vocational institutions to promote the IDA program.

Service learners at the Mirabeau Family Learning Center participated in one-on-one tutoring with middle and high school age youth by mentoring, leading group activities, and acting as computer lab proctors. At the New Orleans Craft Guild, one student helped plan a strategic planning meeting for the Guild, a special school that teaches youth traditional building arts skills and real estate business concepts. Service learners at the New Orleans Neighborhood Development Collaborative worked with a community development corporation that is supported by NONDC by assisting with proformas for real estate developments, completing a neighborhood database, and keeping track of the funds for a new construction project. At the New Orleans Food Co-op, students were responsible for data entry and analysis of a previously distributed survey of grocery shopping habits in the New Orleans area. The data will be used to identify needs and wants of local customers in regards to grocery store development in the New Orleans community. Service learners also wrote a business plan for the New Orleans Food Cooperative based upon information gathered in Spring 2003 and analyzed the local real estate market, identifying potential sites for locating a New Orleans Food Cooperative Grocery Store.

Service learners working with the City of New Orleans Department of Economic Development identified all businesses within a target area, conducted a personal interview with business representatives utilizing a survey to gain information concerning the business's needs and the neighborhoods' needs in relation to the business environment, and incorporated the survey information into a data base format.
