Goals Achieved:

I believe that all of the goals proposed for the exchange program were met during my visit to the Historical Research Center at the University of Arkansas Medical Sciences Library.

Goal: Tour the Historical Research Center to learn more about its history and holdings

Mr. Nutt gave me an extensive tour of his department and of the library. His department appeared to be in excellent order. The staff were all working on projects. I enjoyed seeing his collections. It appeared that the Historical Research Center collects many of the same types of materials as the Blocker Collections. I saw documents, photographs, audio-visual materials, medical instruments, memorabilia and a wonderful infant carrier

Mr. Nutt shared with me the history of the Historical Research Center and how it was established in the late 1970s. He shared several archival collections that document the history of UAMS as well as well as the medical and other health-related professions in Arkansas. As someone who works at obtaining materials for my department, I was impressed with Mr. Nutt's acquisition of the papers of Joycelyn Elders, M.D., the former United States Surgeon General. I believe that Dr. Elder's collection will bring considerable notoriety to the Center. Mr. Nutt also shared how he is attempting to raise the Center's visibility both inside and outside Arkansas through his impressive promotional and programming activities.

Goal: Learn about the Historical Research Center's collecting, access, and use policies and procedures, and programming activities, as well as how the collections are promoted

During my visit to the Historical Research Center, Mr. Nutt shared his collection policies with me regarding the method of how new material is acquired by the Center. I enjoyed seeing how archival materials are exhibited in multiple areas both within and outside of the department.

Mr. Nutt also shared several of his policies and procedures regarding researchers and the use of materials at the Center. We agreed that our policies seemed to be in line with best practices utilized by other institutions.

Goal: Discuss avenues for possible future collaborative projects between the two institutions

Mr. Nutt and I discussed the possibility of collaborating on future projects. Due to time constraints, we were unable to identify a definitive collaboration however, we agreed to research topics that both institutions might find appealing. We agreed to continue to look for possibilities over the next few months.

I do believe that the discussions that Mr. Nutt and I had led to a greater mutual understanding of each other's collections.

Lessons Learned:

My day started with a tour of the Historical Research Center and the UMAS Library. During the tour I met with CaLee Henderson, Digital Initiatives Librarian, Suzanne Easley, Archivist, and April Hughes, Administrative Analyst. Each spoke briefly about some of their recent projects. I was especially interested in Ms. Henderson's work because I would like the Blocker Collections to have a position dedicated to building the department's digital presence.

I gave a presentation entitled "Louis Pasteur, X-Rays and Lunar Housing: Examining the Blocker History of Medicine Collections" to the UAMS faculty and staff. The presentation was an overview of the

holdings at the Moody Medical Library. The presentation was approximately 20 minutes and allowed for approximately 15 minutes of questions afterward. The questions were good and included how we came to obtain many of the classics, how these materials are utilized, and what areas might grow in the future. I actually learned about my own holdings as I prepared for this presentation.

We also visited the Butler Center for Arkansas Studies, a department of the Central Arkansas Library System (CALS). The Butler Center's purpose is to promote a greater understanding and appreciation of Arkansas history, literature, art, and culture. The Research Room of the Roberts Library is shared by the Butler Center and the University of Arkansas at Little Rock's Center for Arkansas History and Culture. The two institutions have made more than 10 million documents and photographs on Arkansas history available for public use. This was a beautiful facility and I enjoyed hearing about the collaborative nature of the Butler Center and the University of Arkansas at Little Rock's Center for Arkansas History and Culture.

Suggestions For Improvement:

I do not have any suggestions for improvement. The visit to the Historical Research Center was insightful. I enjoyed meeting CaLee Henderson, Digital Initiatives Librarian, Suzanne Easley, Archivist, and April Hughes, Administrative Analyst. From what I saw, they worked well together.
