Academic requirements: Must be a Sophomore, Junior, or first semester Senior at the time of application; GPA 3.0 or higher; Aptitude and motivation for advanced study in sciences.

#### **PROGRAM EXPECTATIONS:**

Participants are required to complete the entire ten week program. The research objectives of the program are substantial and require full-time student commitment. At the end of ten weeks, each participant is required to submit a written report describing his/her research and give an oral presentation. Participants must attend all required group sessions, lectures, and social events.
